President Bob Carpenter

Firstly I would like to welcome everyone back from the Christmas Break. I certainly hope that you all had the opportunity to relax and get some time at the field or in the workshop, building or flying your creations. That is what we are all here for.

Over the break your Executive has been working on the challenges of the NSW unification. Discussions are continuing with all the organisations involved and they will continue until we have a definite way forward for all our members.

We have a membership of 2300 individuals in 86 clubs that will be directly affected by the way in which these discussions are proceeding. We do not want to have the members of clubs having to make decisions on which way to go if there is the potential that it will break up clubs and friendships. We want to have a manageable situation that meets the requirements of the majority of our members.



One of the key areas that we became involved with was the need to establish exactly what can be done and whether it is in line with the Rules and Constitutions of both the MAAA and Aeromodellers NSW. I hope you appreciate that with our policy of providing information to our members we then get many different views on the way forward. I know that these ideas are being provided with the best of intention and we do appreciate the input. However, we not only have to work towards a way forward, but it must fit within all our rules and constitutions.

Under the Associations Incorporation Act our Constitution and that of the other organisations binds all members and the Association to the constitution – it is a statutory contract with members and the Association, having rights and obligations that must be met and cannot be arbitrarily removed or avoided. It should also be noted that the Associations Incorporation Acts (in the various states) overrides any Constitution.

To that end, in an effort to establish a correct way forward we met with representatives from the Associations Forum. This is a professional Association that has been formed to provide advice on Governance, Constitutions, and Organisational Restructuring as well as other related areas. This organisation has over 500 Associations as members and was recommended to us.

We had an initial meeting just prior to Christmas (at no charge) where we outlined the present situation. Following the first meeting and ongoing discussions within the Executive we then commissioned them to answer specific questions on the way we are working. When we receive their written response and in an effort to work collaboratively with the other stakeholders we will provide the document to the MAAA Executive.

At this stage we intend to share the information with all our clubs no later than the March Monthly meeting.

You will also see in the minutes of this meeting that we as an organisation decided to join the Associations Forum group as we believe that their services will be an asset to our member clubs moving into the future.

Finally, we have also decided to have ready for the March meeting a survey that will be provided to all individual members. This survey will be attempting to obtain your views on what you want from our organisation. It is only through your feedback that we can actually plan for the future and ensure that Aeromodellers NSW remains a vibrant organisation catering to the requirements of all its members; both clubs and individuals.

General Business:

The first item of General Business is:

- 1. The next General Monthly Management Committee Meeting of Aeromodellers NSW will be held in the Board Room of DOOLEYS Waterview Club, Silverwater commencing at 8pm on Friday 11th March 2016 all members and visitors are welcome.
- 2. The President gave the meeting a brief overview of what actions have been taken on the unification of NSW. There was also discussion about joining the Associations Forum, and a document was circulated to the meeting outlining the features and service they offer. This group are specialists in providing advice to assist bodies like ours (not for profit and large Associations) on best practice and corporate governance issues.

The Executive have commissioned this group at an hourly rate to provide some specialist advice on the current situation and to review a number of documents and the issues in response to specific questions surrounding the unification process that the MAAA is implementing. The Executive advised that when the advice is received that it will be made available to all members for their information, consideration and the development of any responses.

The following motion was developed and put to the meeting: "that we (Aeromodellers NSW) take up Silver membership of the Associations Forum for one year"

3. The Executive is proposing to develop a questionnaire to go out to all members (that is, not just the Clubs) so that they can all have a say as to the direction and the aeromodelling activities they are involved in. The meeting discussed the broad areas and the Executive will develop and look to have a draft set of questions for review at the next meeting.



It was asked if all the results will be made available to the membership, it is the view of the Executive that all details will be available and the redactions that may occur would be names and similar details from a privacy perspective.

The Executive would ask and members who would like a question/s asked please forward them to the Secretary so that they can be included in the survey.

It is proposed to use a combination of electronic (Survey Monkey) as well as having the ability to print a copy out for members who do not have the confidence to complete it on line. The link to the survey will be included in the April Newsletter.

4. A question was asked in relation to the room hire cost and any possible assistance from Dooley's to defray the cost. Enquiries have been made and the club, because of it size is unable to provide any such assistance.

In light of the current discussion questions were asked in relation to opening ANSW up to individual membership. It was discussed in broad terms on managing the communication to clubs and individuals, the question came back as to how is the best way to communicate to some 2300 people. It was also discussed about how changes to MOPS and dissemination of such information could be managed. The Executive will consider the items raised and will continue to explore alternatives once the current issues have been resolved.

Now for Something Completely Different. The "X-29" Slope Soarer Conversion to an EDF Jet (pt 2)

Continued from last month - Part 2.

Back to the big hill full of confidence after the previous successful launch. This time I fitted a video camera to my helmet to analyse the flight.



The Easterly wind was close to 20km/h, slightly stronger than I would like for test flying but it's only a prototype so I thought I either make it or brake it. Off it went again with a powerful throw this time, launching it on my own directly into the wind over the huge gully bellow. What a "difference" after the strengthening of the wing tips. All the nervousness dissapeared moments after gaining full control and completing the first circuit. These are the moments that this great hobby is all about. A little bit of a battle into the wind with this rather inefficient fan combo but down wind she was moving very nicely. I noticed the aileron controls were pretty touchy, probably still due to some wing tip flexing during my turns. Most importantly though, the pitch control worked perfectly after getting the correct canard/elevator mix and angle of efflux.

Whilst enjoying my flight I heard the sound of a motor bike and there he was. The farm owner on

his quad paid me a visit after seeing this weird looking jet flying over. Just about ready to land, I glided it down into the moderate wind under full command by stalling it few inches above the grass to a full stop only some 20 feet in front of myself. The farmer was impressed, not to mention my own satisfaction. A couple more flights with another high performance model I brought along really made my day.



Over the next few days after some more adjustments I had numerous flights including a few basic aerobatic manuevers with video footage analysis back at home. Back on the bench in my hangar I went straight to my original model to reset all controls, as well as the balance and the thrust tube based on this prototype. There were a



few other improvements to the frame such as stiffening some flexing in my elevator stabs to eliminate the possibility of flutter and adding some servo protection fins to the bottom of the fuselage.



Final checks and the next day with a helper friend I decided to take it to the beach at very low tide to do a full range check and perhaps, conditions permitting to do couple of straight low level flight checks. Unfortunatelly, late afternoon with the lowest tide the wind was up to over 30km/h. The range check of all controls at some 200 metres on full power was all positive so I went ahead despite the "don't do it" suggestion from my helper.

The wind was screaming!, but at least this time nicely along the beach and coming from the north. Taking extra precautions I did few taxi runs up and down the beach strip increasing the power gradually. On the next turn into the head wind I increased my throttle to full power being anxious to see the model at least lift off a few inches. To my surprise it did, but more like 3 feet. Instantly reducing the power, the nose dropped but I but

quickly regained full control by adding a little elevator.

"Wonderful", first joey's hop some 15-20 meters in these atrocious conditions, but giving me another boost of confidence. All caught on the film by my friend's hat mounted camera which was later analyzed. Not fully satisfied with the accelleration of my 4S power set up, I spent the next day testing and comparing the static thrust, current draw, wattage and wing loadings of this and few of my similar size models.

Decisions - at the expence of adding more weight, by upgrading to 6S my power went to over 300 Watts per pound compared to my intended lighter 4S set up in low 200's. Some alternations had to be made to fitt this heavier fan unit with the new thrust tube rolled out. With the help of my program card the speed controler was also reset to new values to optimize performance.




This time fitted with the large 4250mA, 25 volt battery the CofG was still spot on and after the static run while holding model vertically, it just about held its AUW at 2400grams confirming this thing will fly. Couldn't wait for the next session to test it, intending to do it again at the beach on smooth, hard-packed sand rather than off the bumpy grass where you can get premature hops with light wing loaded models.

The next opportunity at low tide saw the wind unfortunately blowing 90 degrees across the beach but reasonably low at only 10-15km/h.



Placing the model some 70 metres from my standing position I gradually applied full power, noticing dramatic difference in accelleration, with the model rotating just in front of my position to some 6 feet in height. Immediately reducing throttle and gliding it under full pitch control the model drifted slightly to the right due to the cross wind and having no rudder function and clipped the softer dry part of the beach with the right wing tip.



Horrified, seeing my model pancake, do a "360" at still pretty high speed and comming to a sudden stop I ran some 100 metres expecting the worst – the fuselage broken in half after the impact at the very least. Luckily no such bad luck thanks to the dry soft beach sand. Picking up the model with not



even bent landing gear, placing it back on the hard packed strip closer to the waters edge this time I had another go, being much more careful and rotating lower to only some 3 feet and holding the level a flight lot longer for close to 100 metres and touching down as gently as a ballerina. "This is it", all I wanted to see before my full maiden flight. Almost tempted to take off again and do a full circuit but common sense told me, "be patient and lets do it at the local flying field for safety, just in case".

The surf in such a close proximity is not the best place to do the full test flight without knowing how it will respond during turns. So, pack it up and walk it back home through the reserve with pride.

Next day, visiting one of my clubs and hoping to fly it, the weather conditions just weren't to my full liking and with just a few days to go before Christmas, it got even worse. Horrendous winds and when they stopped the rain came down in buckets. Some of Sydney's suburbs experienced some of the windiest conditions recorded at well over 200 kilometers per hour and were declared as disaster zone, unfortunately also affecting this part of the coast.



Nevertheless, as all the bad things end eventually, the sun came back out again so I have managed to cut the grass strip after all the deluge but the wind was still too high at well over 30km/h, so more delays for my maiden. After my daily check of the weather forecast the first opportunity came on New Year's Day, first thing in the morning with everything ready in my van I headed to the the flying field. Conditions were still not great with moderate wind some 45 degrees across the strip



but I decided to go for it anyway. With fully charged batteries I did my final checks of all controls, placed the model at the end of the strip and gradually increased the throttle to full power, this time off the grass runway.



After few little bumps and hops it cleared the ground just in front of me after a run of some 60 metres and steadily climbed to safe height to just clear the trees on the southern end of the strip.



The first gentle anticlockwise turn was very stable but after few circuits I felt my aileron controls were pretty sensitive so further travel reductions will follow. The pitch controls were just about perfect at any power setting which was my main concern prior to the flight. The speed of the model wasn't as fast as I expected, probably due to this weird swepped forward wing design and the rather large frame for a 70 mm power unit, but on the other hand was very realistic, scale-wise for its size. Landing in the cross wind was a little



challenging with out any rudder function but after a few abrupt corrections I managed to bring it



down nice and gently on this narrow (only 4.5m wide) cut grass portion of the strip. Keeping the flight time to minimum at only 2.5 minutes, the battery check comfirmed the future flight sessions up to 5 minutes on a mix of throttle settings. Absolutely delighted with the successful maiden I enjoyed the rest of the morning flying a few other EDFs that I'd brought along. The first thing I did on my return home was to contact my friend, the original builder of this unique model to give him the good news.

Millennium Cup - Round 1, Appin - 10 January 2016

The forecast for the day was for fine weather with light winds from the north swinging to the north east. The temperature was forecast to be in the high 20s.

Initially the winds were very light from the north and we set up the launch equipment to launch into the anticipated NE winds. However soon after getting underway at 9:25 the wind swung to be from the west and north west and stayed this way for most of the day.

We had 18 pilots enter the competition.

Despite what appeared to be ideal thermalling conditions it was very challenging. There were quite a few six minute flights but they were sprinkled throughout the score sheet and it looked to be random luck as to whether a long flight was possible.

We completed six rounds before we broke for lunch at 12:30, and a further 2 rounds after lunch

There were a couple of incidents through the day. Marc Ceo had the fin fail on the ping and zoom phase and his aircraft pancaked in, still within the boundary of the field. Max Stone had his aircraft 'captured' by a tree (and quite high up too) when on landing approach. The aircraft settled a little lower during the afternoon but remained there until the end of the competition when it was recovered using a line and weight thrown into the tree.

At the end of the day with the scores tallied, first place was taken by Fred Lodden, Bill Gibson came in 2nd and Don Farrar took out third place.




