I have, over the past few months asked for nominations for the next Instructor's Course. At this point in time we only have two or three names. As the cost of running an Instructor's Course is quite considerable in both time and financial cost we will provide a course as soon as we have enough nominations. I need at least 9-10 people to make it cost effective.

Secretary and CASA Liaison Tim Nolan

I am presently re working a number of the risk assessments for display, CASA after the MAAA Conference are now expecting much more detail in these applications. If you are planning an event please contact me so that I can assist with a template that will make it easier for you to understand and supply relevant information.

During the month I completed a new FW25 inspector application on the North Coast, this will be finalised with the MAAA shortly. There are two others outstanding that I will try to complete within the next month. If you are aware of any applications that I have missed then please drop me a line.

Newsletter Editor Rob Masters

We currently have 1600 addresses with some 90 emails bouncing, I am currently following these up with the Club Secretaries via the Registrar. Education Officer Jackie Slaverio

In the past month I have been in various forums and putting forward ideas around how ANSW can work with schools on a number of programs to do with flight and science. I have been invited to contribute to the projects of 10 primary schools and will be exploring ways in which we can engage. I also had a meeting with the Inspector of Science, BOSTES around aeromodelling and the curriculum.

The Bunnings Initiative is expanding - with a few more clubs signing up at the last minute. Thanks to Kevin Dodd - we will be able to supply 100 gliders to each Bunnings location that we will be at. It will be wonderful to read about each event in the coming newsletters.

I have invited a few members to write articles about how they are volunteering and engaging with their community - educating people and promoting aeromodelling.

To all those members and clubs working with universities on the Outback Challenge and other innovative projects - thank you for taking time to assist in the teaching of these students.

Land Purchase Committee Greg Hoy

A project has commenced to review and understand what opportunities are available to establish additional State run flying fields within NSW.

The project will focus on locations that will offer the most efficient use of such facilities and benefits to our members. A number of options will be considered, including potential to purchase land, the establishment of long-term leases or the creation of partnerships with State Recreational Bodies. The initial phase has commenced which includes determining the minimum operating requirements for a such



a flying field. Leading Real Estate Agencies have also been consulted and have provided some guidance on land acquisition in rural areas.

The team will soon be writing to a number of NSW Councils seeking their assistance in finding a suitable location within their Local Government Area. The locating of a field will of course be subject to the land use zoning outlined in the Local Environmental Plan (LEP). If you would like to join the project team, have specific ideas, or know of an area that may be suitable for another NSW State Flying field, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Shoalhaven Model Flying Club Bunnings Display - 1 Sep 16


