My involvement with the sport is, I suspect similar to many. I have always been interested (obsessed maybe) in aircraft. One day when I was around 12 years old my father came home from work with a near new OS .19. Shortly after we (he) bought an Aeroflyte 36" Kittyhawk control line kit which we built over the ensuing weeks. Finally the big day arrived down at the school oval (remember when you could still do that). There we were with what was a control line stunter, overpowered (it was designed for 1.5 to 2.5cc) and

neither had flown before or even knew anyone who had. Stand back says dad, you'd better let me do this. The only part more spectacular than the instant loop on takeoff was the number of pieces one aeroplane could become. Dad never went near a model aeroplane again although it does look like my brother and I may finally be making some headway in getting him back nearly 40 years later.

I persevered during my high school years and did teach myself to fly with a number of mainly Aeroflyte control line models (remember them?), their Taipan trainer, Cobra and another Kittyhawk as well as a number of Taipan diesels (one of which along with a Frog 2.5cc I still have).



At 16 I left home to join the Navy and there my hobby languished despite always remaining an avid aircraft nut. My Navy career ended up lasting 22 years, three of which I spent on HMAS MELBOURNE,



the infamous carrier, although while I was on board we were fortunate in not being involved in any mishaps.

Fast Forward 35 years to 2004 when I was on a business trip to Perth and just happened to be walking past a local hobby shop. The old urge grabbed me – I was powerless. When I walked out I was the proud owner of a new radio set and a SIG 1/6 Piper Cub kit - my favourite aeroplane. When I got home I paid a visit to Werrington Park Model Aero Club, whose aircraft I had often seen flying on the UWS land behind the Cobham Remand Centre. I joined them and set myself up with an ARF trainer and a motor to go with the gear I got in Perth. The rest is as they say history although I must add that it did take me about three years to build my pride and joy, the Sig Cub, complete with fabric covering and dope just the way I used to do it.

The next Business Meeting of MASNSW will be held at the Australian Aviation Museum Bankstown, Friday the 13th of August 2010. The meeting to commence at 8.00pm, (2000hrs), all Visitors and Observers are most welcome.

C 2.19 Bob Carpenter What to do Free Flight? Bob Carpenter has been approached by Free Flight with a formal letter for MASNSW to provide an instructors course for their members. Bob pointed out that the Executive has had lots of internal discussions about this subject over the

Bob pointed out that the Executive has had lots of internal discussions about this subject over the past two to three week period. This was put to the delegates at the meeting and the President asked the members present for their opinions which were duly noted. At this stage the President read out what he considered was the general consensus of the MASNSW Executive, basically telling Free Flight No. Bob went on to read out the basic rules from the MAAA regarding representation and believes that there is more than enough justification for our decision. Bob wants to organise a meeting with Free Flight prior to writing to them.

MASNSW will not restrict members joining Free flight – nor will it dictate to Clubs who they should affiliate with. However, members of MAAA who want to use the services of MASNSW, e.g. Wings System, MOP System and Instructor training will have to be members of MASNSW.

Motion was put by UMAC and Seconded by Springwood Nepean to take the approach as read out by Bob Carpenter which was the general consensus of the MASNSW Executive and the delegates present at the meeting.

The Registrar asked that a letter to Free Flight be raised to ask for a list of their Field locations that are known to fly R/C so that we can maintain separation of 4km

C 2.23 Milton Ulladulla - Letter to President regarding why they have only two members who wish to affiliate with MASNSW, what services MASNSW provide and commenting about availability of Cootamundra Field. The President read the letter to those present at the meeting. It was discussed by those present regarding the balance of the Milton Ulladulla Club being members of Free Flight.

The President noted that under the MASNSW Constitution a Club needs to have three (3) members to affiliate with MASNSW and that to have a Vote they need to have 10. The President will contact them regarding this.

Park Flyers. - George Atkinson the Delegate from WRCS & CFI for the Southern Districts of NSW brought to the attention of the meeting, that there was a video of Mellissa Pool a young Girl in the USA. being struck in the head by the blades of a Helicopter in the county of Tampa, Florida. Police were called to investigate; no charges have been laid as yet. The AMA. have come to the party and donated \$ 11,000.00 towards her health care.

It is the belief that it was a 600 sized helicopter not a small park flyer as reported.

Flying in parks is a dangerous proposition, no matter what size aircraft or helicopter is being used. Clubs and their members must fly within the CASA & MAAA rules.

The President brought up a situation that has popped up once gain, how do members gain access to the Cootamundra State Flying Field. Several ideas were mentioned and it was found that all had been tried before. It was agreed that Steve Norrie would be the best person to contact for the time being as he is the State Flying Field Secretary.

Model Flying and Insurance

We are receiving questions regarding the insurance coverage you have when operating Model Aircraft. The following is an effort to answers those questions.

The insurance coverage that we all have as members of MAAA (all members receive the same coverage whether you operate Radio Control, Control Line or Free Flight Models) covers the flying of Model Aircraft on any site within Australia so long as you have the landowners permission and are operating within CASA rules and MAAA Mop's.

If you have an incident that requires use of that coverage, you will be required to pay the first \$250-00 excess.

If there is an incident you will be required to follow the MOP001 Accident Reporting and the associated forms MAAA010 Incident Report Form and MAAA011 Incident Investigation and provide these forms to MAAA.

When claims are reviewed you will need to be sure that you are operating within the rules and regulations that cover the operation of Model Aircraft. These include in descending order: CASA Rules, MAAA rules and recommendations, Local club rules and regulations, any local council rules etc.

To ensure that we minimize as far as practical any requirement to use our insurance coverage and at the same time provide safe facilities to our members MAAA has MOP022 that covers Risk Assessment. It would be in the best interest of all our members if these documents and policies are reviewed by Club executives to provide confidence in your clubs setup and operations.

Your Insurance coverage is only available with your current membership and therefore is effective from 01st July to 30th June. During the time that you have paid your membership and are awaiting your new cards you will need to be able to prove that you have actually paid your MAAA fees. This is easy if you only fly at your own club, but increasingly we have members that use more than one club and field. It is recommended that until you receive your new membership card that you carry your receipt that indicates that you have paid your MAAA fees.

Red Bull Racing:

Any aircraft which has competed in Full size aerobatics competition is eligible; Minimum wingspan 70 Inches, Maximum Engine size 120 Glo or 30cc Gas. MOP inspection will be required.

Glo and Gas may race together depending on entries; however they will be scored in separate classes. This new class is being trialled to use all the same components as the AT6 Texans as well as allowing the current GAS engines. So bring out those Extras, Edges, Yaks, etc.

C2. 7 - Mike Close: Read to the meeting correspondence from Greg Hoy regarding suggestions for how to involve juniors in the sport

"I was thinking about the younger members and note there are only about 170 odd younger members. If we could find a suitable club in Metro Sydney (somewhere central) could the MASNSW consider, in conjunction with the most suitable hosting club, holding a juniors fun fly. This event would be open to anyone MASNSW member under the age of 16 years, (must not have turned 16). It would be a good opportunity for kids to get together, as most kids are limited dealing with adults at flying fields. The "Kids Fly 2010" could be sponsored by many hobby shops around Sydney providing prizes. If we are lucky we could drag in sponsorship from perhaps McDonalds, Coles (young sports), Qantas, Boeing, Air Bus, Hawker de Havilland, Virgin, Dick Smith. RFDS, RAAF Richmond. The flying would have a number of basic entry and prize categories to share the prizes/awards around. Some of the older kids (with gold wings could buddy up with younger ones to give "tips" on flying manoeuvres. There could be prizes for best spin, roll, loop, knife edge, Low pass, safest in the pits, airman or women ship, Teamwork, (saddest prang or most impressive) etc etc. Nothing too complex to give everyone a go. There could be a demo flight by someone with a monster size plane and/or the largest war bird. But remember this event would be about the younger flyers. Learners under instruction, newly appointed Bronze wings holders and then a small category for the "advanced kid flyer - the ones that already do pattern and comp" There could be a BBQ, fizzy drink and all that stuff. Instructors would be called on from all over to assist, coordinate, and act as field safety officers. For them it would be a learning lesson too. Teaching them to work with, manage and guide children students. It could be open to the public (for viewing/ watching) to perhaps stimulate new members/interest. Kids would / may just inspire their mums or dads to take it up too. If it was successful, it could be a yearly or every two year event. It could be every alternate year, swapping with a war bird fly-in or scale fly-in (Bowylie always seems such a long drive).

Anyway, it up for discussion as an initial idea. Of course a more comprehensive outline/proposal would need to be drafted if it was thought to have some merit. The proposal could seek out some basics on level of interest from sponsors / clubs etc.

MAAA Life Membership

Congratulation to Joe McGuffin, MAS NSW, and Garth Wilmot, TMAA, who were elected as MAAA Life Members at the 2010 MAAA Council Conference for 'services to aeromodelling'.

MAAA Hall of Fame

At the 2010 Conference held in Adelaide at the end of May, Des Slattery was inducted into the MAAA Hall of Fame for 'long term contribution to free flight and MAAA competitions'. Congratulations Des.

Manual of Procedures

The Manual of Procedures is a "live" document and is continually being updated. Please check the MAAA web site from time to time to ensure that you are aware of the latest editions of the documents. The MAAA has recently released the following amended documents in the Manual of Procedures:

MOP032 Certification of Plans and Drawings – MOP032 was introduced to ensure that those MAAA members or non members nominated by the MAAA Scale Subcommittee for the purpose of certifying plans and drawings are appointed, reappointed, registered and deregistered in a standard and traceable process.

MOP030 Gas Turbine Rules - Section (e) was amended to include the requirement of additional information to allow the MAAA Executive to make informed decisions in regard to issuing Fire Ban Waivers. To assist Event Organisers to provide this information, a new MAAA Form 025 has been introduced.

MOP058 2.4GHz Equipment - Amendments to MOP058 - Added to Appendix A: Frsky V8 ACCST 2.4 GHz and the Fly-Dream V3 2.4 GHz radios.

2010 - 2011 MAAA Membership Fees

As has been the practice in the past, every three years MAAA tests the insurance market and invites quotes from other brokers. Of the two received for the 2010/11 period, the current broker, Willis Australia, provided the most favourable insurance quote with a small decrease in premium. Albeit with some increases in budgeted spending, the MAAA fees for the coming year remain the same.

MAAA fees are as follows: Seniors - \$60.00, Pensioners - \$60.00 and Juniors - \$30.00. State Association and Club fees are in addition to the MAAA fee. Half year fees will apply after 1 January 2011 for new members.

Sticking Membership Cards

Members have brought the problem of membership cards sticking closed to the attention of the MAAA Registrar. This has become especially prevalent with the current card. Investigations have shown that the laminate on the inside of the card has started to break down over the two years since being produced, mainly due to heat. The problem is more pronounced with cards carried in wallets rather than in handbags. To solve the problem I do not suggest you all go out and buy a handbag!! As the current stock of cards has just about been depleted, new cards were ordered for the renewal period 2010/11 which have no laminate on the inside so the problem should be eliminated.

Outcomes from Reported Incidents

Over the last twelve months there has been a sharp increase in insurance pay outs for the repair of vehicles damaged by model aircraft or stones. In several of these cases, the uncontrolled flight path of the model due to structural failure caused damage to cars that were acceptably parked. In other cases, damage could probably have been avoided with some extra thought when parking. It is difficult to advise members on the best position to park cars at model fields or to give an indication of what is a safe distance to be when mowing is taking place. As stated in the incident reports, in the case of stones being thrown by mowers, these distances can be large. However, members are asked to consider the safety of all vehicles when parking at the field to avoid the cost and inconvenience of having repairs carried out.

In one incident which resulted in damage to a vehicle, an electric model was fitted with a 'toggle' switch to turn it on and off. Whilst the exact reason for the model being uncontrolled from the point of launch was not able to be determined due to the destruction of the model on impact with the vehicle, investigations established a strong link to the on/off switch being accidentally moved at the time of launching. If 'toggle' switches are being used, then members are requested to ensure that these switches are well protected from external unwanted activation.

In another incident, a model was launched from a part of the field which then resulted in it being flown over an out-of-bounds area containing parked vehicles. Subsequently, in manoeuvring for landing, the pilot lost control of the model and it collided with a one of the parked vehicles. Fortunately, in this case the damage was minimal.

As a result of this incident and as part of the 'close out', the MAAA recommends that all clubs should have a map of their field on their club notice board for members' and visitors' information, and it should included details of the out-of-bounds flying areas.

2010 Free Flight Trans Tasman Competition

Congratulations to the Australian and New Zealand Free Flight teams who competed for the 'Rose Bowl' in Omarama, New Zealand in April. Reports indicate that all three classes had to be flown on the same day, Friday 16th, because the preceding day, which was to have been for F1A, was extremely windy. The results are quite outstanding as Omarama is always a tricky site even when it is calm. However, it was noted that the NZ Team put in their best ever performance – it was just that the Australian team did better. Two thirds of them maxed out, including all three Wakefield flyers, which meant finding space on the flight home for the Bowl.

Wings and Forms

A couple of issues of the MAAA Newsletter ago, it was explained that irrespective of which State Association you are a member of, the insurance enjoyed by all MAAA members is the same value. Similarly, this also applies to 'Wings'. Whatever type of wings is issued, it is issued by an MAAA Instructor and Gold or Bronze Wings issued through one Association apply throughout Australia.

Following a successful flight test for 'Wings' the application form needs to be lodged with the member's **State Association Secretary** for processing. The flight test depicted on the forms only changes if endorsed by the Flight Training Subcommittee, the MAAA Executive and the MAAA Council, and then for good reasons such as safety. From time to time however, it is necessary to amend the form for other reasons, such as adding a line for an email address or clarifying a word. While the latest form should be used, common sense should also apply when processing 'Wings' applications.


