

Newsletter Editor: - Robert Masters:

The first Newsletter (#329) since Registrations for 2010/2011 has now gone out and unfortunately, despite hopes that we would resolve the high rate of bouncebacks we had been getting due to bad email addresses we are still not doing very well.

We have 1209 members who have elected to receive their newsletter by email. Of these, 168 bounced due to various reasons including:

 Typos - examples discovered right down the line from the member to the club and through to the Registrar and myself.

- Email addresses have been changed since registration and the change has not been passed on to the Registrar.
- Mailboxes are full and the member's ISP has rejected the email.
- The members email server has detected a mass mail out and considered it as spam (this seems to occur mostly where the member uses a "work" email address.

So far, of the 168 we have managed to resolve 130. We did this by looking for obvious typos (so&so@bugpond.com for example), checking the hard copy of the registration returns, cross referencing to the email address provided last year and finally, contacting the respective Club Secretary. We now have 16 still bouncing despite assurances that the address is correct and 22 for which we are still awaiting responses.

As you can appreciate, all this has taken hours and hours of work and I would particularly like to thank Dave Lewis for all the time he has put in and also for sending out the 130 that we appear to have resolved whilst I was interstate on business earlier this week.

To finish off, if you have elected to receive your Newsletter via email and it has not arrived in your inbox I am happy for you to email me directly. I will send you a return email to confirm the address (with the current Newsletter attached) and pass it on to Dave so that he can update the MAAA database.

Other than that, please keep the photos and any other items of interest coming – I will acknowledge receipt but please be patient as I travel on business quite a lot and can currently only access my MAS email account via webmail when away.

National Air Races Cootamundra

Planning for the MAS conducted National Air Races on the State Flying Field at Cootamundra on the 16-17 October is well underway. Entry forms have been sent to flyers from the Eastern states with entries starting to arrive. The field is looking good but the whole of the Cootamundra area has had above average rainfall over the past few months. The field will be available for practice from Friday 15th afternoon and Racing will commence at 12 noon on the 16th. A new class is being trialled this year. Red Bull Racing:

Any aircraft which has competed in Full size aerobatics competition is eligible;

Minimum wingspan 70 Inches,

Maximum Engine size 120 Glow or 30cc Gas.

MOP inspection will be required.

Glow and Gas may race together depending on entries; however they will be scored in separate classes.

This new class is being trialled to use all the same components as the AT6 Texans as well as allowing the current GAS engines. So bring out those Extras, Edges, Yaks, etc.

Manual of Procedures

The Manual of Procedures is a "live" document and is continually being updated. Please check the MAAA web site from time to time to ensure that you are aware of the latest editions of the documents. The MAAA has recently released the following amended documents in the Manual of Procedures:

MOP027 Guideline for the Award of MAAA Wings - Amendments to the Helicopter Bronze and Gold Wings including the associated forms.

MOP058 2.4GHz Equipment - Amendments to MOP058 – Addition of 2.4Ghz Downlinks quide. (see next item in Newsletter).

Added to Appendix A: Amended Frsky to V8 ACCST 2.4 GHz and V8 compatible systems. ESCALE 2.4 GHz Radio Control System 242.

2.4GHz Downlinks

A recent amendment to MOP058 2.4GHz Equipment was the addition of a guidance section for 2.4GHz Downlinks. A common form of downlinks is miniature video equipment, readily available for use in models. Video downlinks use different technology to that used for model control. Many of the systems available do comply with Australian standards but that does not mean that they can be used with impunity on model aircraft, particularly when operating on 2.4 GHz.

Many users have found no issues with video downlinks but there are reports of mutual interference. Whilst this can be just with the video quality, there can also be interference with the model control system. MOP058 is available on the MAAA website for further information and guidance on video downlinks.

Frequently Asked Questions

A recent addition to the MAAA website at www.maaa.asn.au is a Frequently Asked Questions page. The page is broken up into two sections at this stage, one for general questions and the second relating to questions and answers regarding 2.4GHz equipment. The intention of this page is to provide members and prospective members with easy access to typical, everyday information, which may not be contained within the MOPs


2010 - 2011 MAAA Membership

Members are reminded that the MAAA Membership period runs from 1st July to the 30th June each year. All membership expires at midnight on the 30th June. To continue to enjoy flying and to be covered under the MAAA insurance for the next financial year, your membership needs to be renewed with your club. Once the required fees are paid to your club and a receipt issued, this then is proof of current membership until you have received a valid MAAA Membership Card for the new period.

Outcomes from Reported Incidents

As reported in the last MAAA Newsletter there has been a sharp increase in insurance pay outs for the repair of vehicles damaged by model aircraft and this continues to be cause for concern. In most cases, damage could probably have been avoided with some extra thought when parking vehicles at model fields. Due to the large payouts being made by MAAA to repair vehicles, a review of the MOPs dealing with distances which vehicles should be parked from is currently underway.

Several Incidents resulting in damage to vehicles were due to pilots losing sight of their



model in the sun when taking off. This has been more prevalent in the morning or evening when the sun is low on the horizon. If this is a situation which occurs at your flying field during this time of year, then it is asked that members and visitors are made aware of the hazard, both verbally and by notices.

Unfortunately, there continues to be a regular flow of incidents where members' fingers have come into contact with spinning propellers. With risk minimisation in mind and following a suggestion from a VMAA Member, a safety brochure was commissioned and produced by MAAA. This A3 brochure (shown) is meant to be a stark reminder of the dangers involved in and around propellers. The brochure is currently being printed and will be distributed to all State Associations for their Clubs.

64th MAAA Nationals Dalby Queensland

The Chairman of the MAAQ organising committee has confirmed that arrangements for the 64th Nationals are on schedule and he hopes to make it 'the best Nationals ever'. Club News & Reports

Millennium Cup - Round 5 - Cowra - 11&12 September 2010

What a great two days of thermal flying were had at Cowra.

Despite the forecasts that were issued around the middle of the week predicting rain and strong winds, the weekend weather was superb for glider flying. On both days the winds were very light and variable with temperatures in the low 20s. The sky was mostly clear and blue but occasionally cloud would form up. When the cloud was overhead the temperature would drop but it never looked like there would be any precipitation. Much of the lift was very light but at times there were some boomer thermals in the vicinity of the field.

We had 15 pilots compete on each day. On Day 1 we were able to complete 7 rounds and on Day 2 we completed 6 rounds. The progress on Day 2 was slowed by the fact that the retriever has expired late on Day 1 and so on Day 2 all parachute retrievals were done manually on foot. With the light winds the parachute was dropping very near the turnaround necessitating almost a full 200m walk to return it to the launch point.

The Day 1 podium was Fred Lodden 1st, Jack Murphy 2nd and Bill Gibson in 3rd place.

The Day 2 podium was Fred Lodden 1st, Dave Symons 2nd and Jack Murphy 3rd.

The combined results for both days were Fred Lodden 1st, Jack Murphy 2nd and Dave Symons 3rd. Geoff Symons was the 1st Junior on both days and took the overall result for 1st Junior.

Congratulations to the placegetters. Fred Lodden.





The day's program will include a special open day lecture by Australia's first female pilot for a major airline, Captain Deborah Lawrie (Wardley), behind-the-scenes tours of The Sir Henry Barraclough Collection of early 20th century aero engines, a demonstration and display by transport artist, Steve Leadenham, make-and-do activities for the young and much more.

OPEN DAY PROGRAM 10.00am—4.00pm

Captain Deborah Lawrie (Wardley): Australia's First Female Pilot for a Major Airline: 11.30am + 1.00pm (30 minutes) Join Deborah for an insightful lecture as she shares her story of becoming Australia's first female pilot to break into the male-dominated cockpits of Ansett Airlines. Deborah first obtained a private pilot licence in 1971 (aged 18) and then a commercial pilot licence in 1973. Following numerous rejected applications into the Ansett pilot training program, she took her case to the then new Victorian Equal Opportunity Board, who ruled that Ansett's refusal to employ her was illegal and ordered Ansett to include her in its next pilot training program. The case is still used as a legal precedent. Deborah went on to fly the Fokker F27, McDonnell Douglas DC-9, Boeing 727 and the Boeing 737. Later with KLM Royal Dutch Airlines she flew the Fokker 50, 70 and 100 and the Airbus A330. Today Deborah works as a flight safety investigator and flies the A320 with Jetstar. Free with general admission.
