

Reports

Treasurer Steve Norrie

The Treasurer's reports for Dec 2018 and Jan 2019 were circulated in bulletin 23 2018 2019.

The report for February and March 2019 was presented to the meeting and will subsequently be circulated in an Email Bulletin. Additional expenses were submitted and detailed for the attendees.

President and CASA Liaison Tim Nolan

It has been a very busy time for all of us with a significant increase in the number of Area Approvals and Height Exemptions. Well done to those who have completed the Risk Assessments and now have completed Area Approvals. The effort from everyone on the team to help get all the jobs done has been amazing so a big thanks to all.

The question is often asked "...do I need an Area Approval?" The answer to this has two parts.

If you are within 3nm (5 kilometres) of a Controlled Aerodrome, then yes, you need an Area Approval.

The second part, if you want to fly above 400'agl then you will need an Area Approval with a Height Exemption. In support of your application you will need to complete a few forms; a Risk Assessment, have your land owner's permission and provide the reasons why you require the additional height clearance above 400'agl.

You will all have been flooded with emails, rumours, whispers and advice from RC Groups and other social media forums, not to mention the club bush lawyers, about the new CASA drone registration. This has been directed by the Federal Government following the Senate Enquiry into drones, at which both the MAAA and Aeromodellers NSW gave evidence. It was made very clear to us that the Senators saw the MAAA members as part of the solution and not the problem. Those who choose through ignorance or arrogance not to fly by the rules ruin things for all of us and the result is tighter restrictions for all of us and our airspace usage.

There is a document called the "Deed of Agreement" between the MAAA and CASA, and this sets out in very simple, clear terms what the obligations are upon the MAAA, its Ordinary Members (each State body) and the Affiliate Members (individual members). In return this allows us certain privileges and exemptions from the Regulations, including FPV racing and flying, night flying, heavy models, streamlined public display procedures, Area Approvals and Height Exemptions.

The information that Clive has been requesting on behalf of the MAAA is the next part of the puzzle for dealing with the exemptions that MAAA will receive from aircraft registrations and pilots' accreditation. It will be a requirement for us to advise CASA and maintain an up to date register of all MAAA flying sites, all slope sites, infrequently used sites for special events, such as the annual SAM1788 event, float flying locations, private air strips and for those who fly off their own farms, yes, those too.



As you have seen with the correspondence from MAAA, Gliders have been exempted but we are waiting to see the final details so that we can deliver a consistent message and draft suitable policies that comply with the Legislation. By the time you read this we should be close to a final version. The Legislation commences in June but the rollout is being staged, with Commercial Operators being addressed first and 'the excluded sub 2kg category' and Recreational users sorted toward the end of the year.

CASA recognises that we MAAA members have a sound safety culture and are a relatively low risk, given the locations from where we operate and the general skills, training systems, inspections systems and pilot accreditations, all these have and continue to stand us in good stead with these changes.

CASA received over 4000+ responses to their questionnaire. We were complemented by CASA on the quality and thought that many of you put into your feedback. Well done!

I would encourage you all to continue to have fun and fly safe. We, as your elected representatives, are doing the very best we can to ensure that we can continue to operate as we have up to now and into the future.

The next meeting is the 2019 Annual General Meeting and there are some parts of the Constitution that need adjusting. These will be circulated within the appropriate time frames. I would encourage you to review and support them.

We are at an interesting time in the evolution of our sport. There are a number of smaller jobs that could well use some support. If you have any interest in joining the Executive of Aeromodellers NSW please get in touch with any member of the Executive. A few hours a month would make a big difference in sharing some jobs around that need attention of fellow aeromodellers. We have some great plans ahead for our sport and for clubs around the state of NSW so come, join Aeromodellers NSW.

As your elected representatives, remember that we are all volunteers just trying to grow the sport that we are all passionate about, so, before you complain... have you considered volunteering to help?

Please also note that any requalification course requires a classroom facility (not at the flying field) for part of the session.

State Flying Field Cootamundra Club

Six events run so far this year with eight still to run.

Attendees have been giving very positive feedback on the Cootamundra facility, the new watering system is functioning well, the kitchen has been upgraded and a new electric submersible bore pump is being installed.

Thanks to the Cootamundra membership who provide all of the labour for all the development projects on an entirely voluntary basis. Their hard work is recognised, and the club facilities are a tribute to their hard work and dedication.

Safety Commentary All Clubs

This is a new item for the agenda of the bi-monthly meetings. Not a witch-hunt, but designed to report on incidents, what has been learned/implemented as a result, so that all clubs and fliers can benefit.

There have been 2 incidents at CVRCMAS in the last quarter, both resulting in cuts after engines had started and caught the person starting the model by surprise. Whilst incidents of this nature are not



unusual, it is notable that the club has conducted a review and implemented a helper system for IC model starting/moving from pits to flight line. The club has also noticed a need for guidance notes on arming electrics and has added these to the safety briefing document for the club members.

General and New Business:

- 1. Budget for 2019/2020 fiscal year item for discussion. Being prepared for AGM. It looks like the closing position in 18/19 will be a surplus of around \$1000.
- 2. Fees for 2019/2020 fiscal year item for discussion. The meeting suggested that an increase of \$5 for seniors (zero for juniors) be put to the AGM for ratification. This increase to be regardless of any adjustment of MAAA fees.
- 3. Suggested item for AGM, for discussion, that any item costing in excess of \$1000 would be brought to a meeting of the ANSW committee for discussion and, if deemed appropriate, for approval. Where possible, this would take place at a bi-monthly meeting but, for urgent matters, the ANSW committee would meet and a quorum would be required for approval.
- 4. Discussion item MAAA grant scheme and requirement of State body to provide financial support to clubs that are requesting MAAA assistance. Proposal for approval is that ANSW will assess each application at a quorum of committee members taking into account the applying club's history, efforts to grow membership and willingness to support all aeromodelling disciplines. If it is agreed that the application will be supported, then ANSW will agree to contribute up to the amount that the club contributes, subject to a maximum of \$1500 and subject to the application being successful with the MAAA grant programme.
- 5. ANSW new policy proposal for consideration prior to AGM: ANSW will provide emergency relief funding to clubs up to the amount of \$5,000 in the event of an adverse event (storm, flooding, fire). This is an interest free loan that shall be paid back to ANSW within 12 months from the time of funds transfer. Repayments to ANSW shall be in two lots of \$2,500. The provision of emergency loan funds is at the discretion of the ANSW committee.
 - This motion was discussed at the February meeting and it was agreed that it be circulated as part of the minutes in the newsletter for all clubs to consider before we look to formally introduce this as a policy for ANSW at the April meeting. All members are encouraged to comment back to the Secretary. No comments received.
- 6. Proposed constitution changes in the interest of continuity, it is proposed that the executive/committee members of ANSW be elected for a 2 year period rather than 1 year, with an arrangement that the president would not be changed in the same year as the Vice President or Secretary. The current constitution also calls for monthly meetings of the Management Committee whereas we have found that bi-monthly meetings are frequent enough and may, from time to time, be too frequent. It is proposed that the constitution be changed to allow for, at least four meetings per year (although we currently hold more) and that the AGM date be changed in the constitution to June (not May as it used to be). These proposed changes will be put to the vote at the 2019 AGM and are outlined in Appendix 1 to these minutes.
- 7. The next Bi-Monthly Management Committee Meeting and Annual General Meeting will be held at Dooley's Waterview and will be Friday 14th June 2019 at 8:00pm.

Club News & General Interest

Lessons Learnt with an Outcome of New Procedures. Revised Safety Code for Camden Valley Members.

Following two recent accidents, Camden Valley Club discussed the lessons learnt with its members at their recent business meeting. The members involved in these accidents were experienced, so why did they happen? We asked ourselves "Were their mind and eyes on the task, did they lose grip or balance, did they follow procedures or did they get into the line of fire. Were they rushing, fatigued or frustrated"?

In both cases the models were new with larger engines and propellers and they had had difficulty starting them. To the best of our knowledge they carried out all the right preparations. They may have been frustrated but they certainly got in the line of fire, albeit by accident.

The outcome of our analysis was to ask everyone to be careful and proactively aware when starting engines. We also recommended that all members "ask a mate" to help during the starting and arming of both IC and electric motors.

After reviewing what had happened we decided to amend our Safety Code on IC engines with additional guidance and to include a new section for Electric motors for clarity. Here's how they now read...

- 5. All propeller engines 2.5cc and over are not to be started by bare fingers. Glow drivers must not be removed from over the engine's propeller. Tuning and maintenance should be adjusted behind the propeller. Never reach over or stand alongside rotating objects.
- 19. All aircraft with an electric propulsion system must only have the battery connected to power the motor whilst restrained by the pilot, a helper or a mechanical device.
- a) Battery connection to the motor is preferably carried out on the taxiway or flight line by another person.
- b) If the radio transmitter in use or the aircraft system has a switch facility that can disarm the motor then this must remain in the off position until arrival at the taxiway or flight line.
- c) For testing or range check a separate power source that can be isolated (from the motor) is preferred. In any case, the aircraft must be restrained.
- d) On landing aircraft must be disarmed.

It was also an opportunity to talk about our risk management processes, flight safety and general rules of the club. They had so much fun they didn't want to leave – until the weather turned and the rain started pouring down...



Wednesday arrived all too soon. There was a lot of planning in the background. We had 8 different activities and flight demonstrations. The cadets were engaged and inspired. Flight sims on the deck of the clubhouse, NASA JPL scientist videos were being played on a big screen TV, MAAA balsa plane activities, aerospace and aviation problem solving tasks and team work activities were interspersed with buddy boxing and drone flying. When flight demonstrations were happening, everyone would stop their activities and watch. One of the cadets wrote in their evaluation: "Pretty much just learnt about a world I didn't know existed."

At lunchtime the barbeque was fired up – beef steaks and chicken, fried onions, rolls and salad. Fruits, water and various sweets were rolled out to feed the hungry hoards.


