
Newsletter 438 – April 2021



There was a great writeup from Max published in the April 2015 ANSW Newsletter and in his honour, I have re-published it in full here - Ed.

Max Stone's Thoughts and Memories after Reading Ken Burke's Book - "Politics and Personalities in Australian Aeromodelling"

Joe McGuffin once asked me to do a review of Ken Burke's Book - "Politics and Personalities in Australian Aeromodelling" for the MASNSW newsletter. I showed my review to Mr Burke before it was published so that he could OK it. He lived at Watson's Bay but unfortunately passed away in December 2014. Here is my review of "Politics & Personalities in Australian Aeromodelling" Book 1

1928 -1950 by Kenneth J Bourke (there were to have been two more books).

It has 260 odd pages and was originally advertised on the back page of MASNSW Newsletter 318 (now also in issues 369 and 370 - 2014).

If this history had never been recorded it all would have been lost forever. But I must say it is heavy



reading - the Politics and personalities theme runs through it all.

I learnt about the pre 2nd World War modelling in Sydney and NSW from this book. How the Air Race from England to Melbourne in 1934 made the country very air minded. How Radio stations promoted model aircraft. 2BL had a Boys Aero Club timeslot from 1929. Norman J Lyons did the presentation. He organised a club "MAA" - it had paid membership and a correct structure.

Charles Ivor Freeman in late 1931 had a slot on station 2UE. His club was MFC and it had free membership.

The Herald and Telegraph newspapers had columns too.

In 1935 The Australian Women's Weekly carried an advertisement "Give every boy and girl a 25 shilling cabin monoplane for only 4 shillings, post free. Only 4 tokens to collect in 4 short weeks". They sold thousands.

You will have to read the book to find out more. Be warned, as the title suggests it is mainly about politics and personalities. The book doesn't tell you much about the planes or the motors.

Over 4/5s of the book covers the period to the middle 1940s the other 1/5 up to 1950.

Bob Lowe of Hobbyco arranged a competition in Centennial Park in March 1947. He offered a silver cup and £3 for a whip control contest (Hobbyco sold these planes so was promoting them) and also a Whirlwind motor for the winner of a Control line contest (which Jack Finneran won).

There were quite a lot of spectators there that day and eventually when we had monthly meetings in the park there were even more spectators.

The book says there were 5 control line planes there. I was there that day (not yet 16yrs old in March 1947) and I have one photo with 4 of the planes in it and another photo with one plane in it.

I do not know the name of the owner of this one. Unfortunately, I have misplaced the photo of the single aeroplane.

One of the planes didn't get off the ground that day it was Harold Stevenson's. I met Harold there that day 68 years ago and found he (and Dawn) were living 1.5Km from where I lived.

The following weekend at the local park with my fast running, another prop and a big push Harold had the plane airborne. Soon after with a better prop (we had to make our own then) and adjustments to the rigging etc it flew ok without my running.

The engines were spark ignition so you had to have points for the spark. A coil and condenser plus 4 AA batteries which made the plane heavy. Hard to do even wing overs.


As the engines had bronze main bearings and no seal, pressure in the crankcase forced oil out onto the points and made the engine hard to start (only hand starting then – oil got onto the points). Harold had a rear carbie engine (can be timed by the piston) in it then which he made himself - a copy of an American Ohlsson 23.

I do not remember how — someone must have arranged a meeting of interested modellers that were at Centennial Park that day and it was decided that a Club should be formed.

Because it was a long time ago a meeting was held at the YMCA in Sydney I think (but am not sure) in April and May. I have a receipt for my membership fees from 21-5-47 to the 31-5-1948 signed by A Peters, Treasurer of the MAA for 5 shillings for the year. The receipt is No 14. At the general meeting they said that this No14 would be my Plane Number.


Now I always wondered why on my Membership Certificate my plane No was given as No 31. Well the book explains it — The Committee in their wisdom said members from before the War would





have the lowest numbers then the people who had planes – then the rest of us. Makes sense now.

My next receipt 6-5-48 till 31-5-49 still says MAA and was No 74. I guess there were less than 60 members for the year. By the way, the Membership Certificate looks the same as was used by the pre-war MAA because there is a picture of it in the Book on page 112.



In my photo taken in March 1947 with 4 planes in it (mentioned previously) the one at the back is Arthur Wild's and you can see MAA on the side of it. I would not have known what it meant back then. The next plane is Jack Finneran's, then Bill Marden's and then Harold Stevenson's in the front. I also have a picture of a plane by itself. I do not know the owners name but as mentioned, unfortunately I have misplaced it.

In the Book on Page 155 there is a picture of 24 people and their planes in Centennial Park. I think at the earliest it would be late 1947 or more likely



taken in 1948 or 49 as I do not think there were that many people with motors and control line planes in early 1947.

At the time of the meeting I hadn't heard of glow plugs or diesel engines (I was only 15 - 16 then).

Harold converted his to a Glo Plug later that year. In the following few months Harold Stevenson made three more engines - 23s with the carbie at the front porting controlled by the crankshaft — more powerful and better timing. I bought the first one he ever sold it cost £5 (\$10), approximately the bring home pay for a week's work as a tradesman. I gave him £2 (\$4) and paid him 10 shillings (\$1) a month till it was paid off. He used one himself and he doesn't remember who he sold the other one to.

It was over a year before Harold and Bill Marden made a large batch for sale. I was a 1st year apprentice at Qantas Empire Airways and my pay was 30 shillings a week (\$3) - half went for rent. I left school at 15 and spent the next three years going to night tech to get my Leaving Certificate (as it was called then). The point is I didn't have enough time to keep flying model planes so after the middle of 1948 I could not remain an active modeller. I did go as a spectator to the 1948 Nationals at Bankstown (in November).

I became interested in Radio Control in the middle 80s when I saw RC Gliders at Dobroyd Head (near Manly) and I am still interested in RC Gliders.



I lived in the country (NSW) from 1938 to 1946 and flew free flight gliders then (couldn't get rubber) and I was at school.

If you have read the review this far thank you. I personally found the book tough going - like it says Politics & Personalities and not a lot of

Aeromodelling - but it is our history. Mr Burke deserves our thanks for writing down our early history so it isn't lost.

We will continue to monitor and seeking more clarity surrounding this issue.

I will leave David Kennedy to report on the Casino Fly-In. We will be sending out feedback forms to those who attended looking to take the most out of the event and how to improve it in the future.

The inaugural Casino Airport Richmond Valley Large Scale Fly In was held over the Easter Break from Thursday 1st April to Monday 5th April and was an unmitigated success and a truly memorable event for the aircraft present, the camaraderie and friendships formed and, of course, the weather. For those who were not there, it rained, following by more rain, a bit of sunshine and then more rain.

Whilst the numbers were ultimately down on expectations due to last-minute COVID-19 lockdowns, there were in excess of forty pilots and a huge variety of aircraft present - amazingly numbering well over one



hundred, and then the Garles had their stunning Fokker DR-1 60% scale triplane, which was a sight to behold during a low and slow sunset pass across the field.

Whether it was a flock of 3D pilots trying to go lower than the rest, or the screaming jets performing unbelievable aerobatics, the huge number of giant scale gliders gracefully floating around, or the large scale types such as the 50% Decathlon putting on a very low and wonderful scale aerobatic display, there was always something going on at the flight line to entertain fellow pilots and the public alike.

Despite the weather, the number of members of the public who visited the event over the five days was very good, and judging by their reactions and comments, a great time was had by all. The Mayor, Mr Robert Mustow, and his wife, paid us a visit on Saturday and spent a great deal of time looking over the aircraft on display and chatting with the ANSW President and MAAA Secretary. He was quite impressed and welcoming of the event and is very much looking forward to an even bigger and better showing next year.

As is always the case with events of this type, they are made by the pilots and their aircraft that attend and all thanks needs to go to everyone in attendance. You made the event what it was. Special thanks also need to go to all the event organisers, especially Tyson and Jordana Dodd for their amazing efforts co-ordinating the day-to-day activities, breakfasts, lunches and dinners and a great deal of the operational issues throughout the event.

In the end, despite the weather, or perhaps because of it, I am quite certain everyone would agree that the event was a spectacular beginning to what will surely become a key fixture on the aeromodellers calendar for years to come.

1. Fees for the coming year were discussed, and a number of alternative models reviewed.

The half-year fee to remain at \$30.

2. There will be a motion at the June AGM to add videoconferencing as a formally acceptable meeting format, along the following lines:

35 Use of technology

- (1) A member not physically present at a general meeting may be permitted to participate in the meeting by the use of technology that allows that member and the members present at the meeting to clearly and simultaneously communicate with each other.
- (2) For the purposes of this Part, a member participating in a general meeting as permitted under subrule (1) is taken to be present at the meeting and, if the member votes at the meeting, is taken to have voted in person.
- 3. Club Assistance Scheme. Applications from the following clubs were presented and approved for ANSW support, to now be presented to MAAA:
 - a. Grafton
 - b. SAM
 - c. WRCS
- 4. Standing item upcoming events:

 45. No further action but recommended that all clubs/pilots have access to a fully stocked first aid kit and tetanus booster be kept up to date.

It was noted that the use of drones for photography needs to follow CASA guidelines and that shots taken from above a group of people are in breach of the CASA code: "You must not fly your drone over or above people at any time or height". Members are also reminded to consider, carefully, the potential impact of anything that they post on social media.



- 7. Clubs are reminded that any request for endorsement of the MAAA insurance policies (such as noting of third-party interests) should be sent to the ANSW Secretary for handling. secretary@nsw.aeromodellers.org.au
- 8. Clubs are also requested to avoid contacting the MAAA Secretary directly, as many of the issues that are communicated to him should be handled at a state level.
- 9. Springwood Nepean club questioned the change of MAAA maximum for club assistance from \$5000 to \$5500 and suggested that the amount should not vary year on year.
- 10. The current plan is that <u>the next general meeting will be held on Friday 11th June 2021 at 7:30pm</u>. Club News & General Interest Safety Matters Daryl Woolfe A

G'day to all ANSW members and those who read our newsletters all over the world,

I would like to start with a huge thankyou to those who helped out and ran the Richmond Valley Large Model Fly In over the Easter weekend in Casino.

This time I would like to bring up safety at home. While home based accidents do not come under the incident reporting scenario, they are most certainly abundant and the frequency of serious accidents is quite alarming and possibly life changing. I am getting stories of people who have lost the tops of their fingers to a carnivorous propeller, been slashed by a Jack the Ripper style blade and generally keeping the ER room in ample supply of work [victims?]. Some could have been very serious, and I know of one incident that was a millimetre away from being fatal. I can imagine the headlines for that!

This incident was a few years ago and has been retold several times so the truth may have stretched just a fraction at each retelling, however, it will make sobering reading nonetheless. The story, as related to me, involved a large model swinging a big propeller, a young child, a proud granddad, two ambulances and a, thankfully, happy ending. The granddad was showing his nice new model to the family. The model had no wings fitted and the granddad started the engine for the family to hear. At this point, the grandson [about three years old] either got excited or scared and moved rapidly and accidently kicked the throttle stick to full.

The aircraft leapt forward and the granddad got between it and the child and the aircraft obliged by virtually climbing up the granddads leg and causing a very significant lacerations in the groin area. While the old man and twins escaped decapitation, the inside of his thigh was laid open and actually exposed the femoral artery.

An Ambulance was called and the situation got worse. Upon arrival, the Paramedic saw the nasty wound and went back to his vehicle to get extra materials to treat the injury. Unfortunately, he did not see the low hanging branch and knocked himself cold. 000 again and a second Ambulance was called for.

The end of the story was a happy outcome for all, but it was so close to being a tragedy it really was not funny.

Of course, one has to remember that this story has been told several times, but the fact that the femoral artery was exposed is one hundred percent true.

Another home incident occurred only a short while ago and the victim, a long term modeller, was very lucky not to have the top of his left index finger amputated, the damage was that bad. Our subject this time was running a Saito FA100 using slotted engine mounts and had neglected to secure the engine to the mounts. Well at least not securely enough.

The engine shifted forward and, in a reflex reaction, he put his hand forward to prevent the advancement of the engine and propeller. BITE. Our member left the engine running, a testament to the power of a Saito, went inside and grabbed a towel to stem the bleeding and was driven to the hospital. From there he rang another club member to go and shut the, still running, engine off. The initial consult indicated that the mangled finger would have to be amputated at the knuckle. Luckily, a visiting finger surgeon was called and the finger saved. Today it is very hard to notice that



there was ever a problem. But ask the owner just how fortunate he considers himself to be.

These are just two in the list of dozens of incidents that I have seen or heard about in just a few years.

I encourage members to do the math on a spinning propeller and work out how many bites per second you can get from a two blade propeller and from a four. The result might surprise you.

I just added up the number of stitches as told to me by five modellers that I know. A grand total of one hundred and thirty. One pilot had over seventy in his belly when an electric powered model suddenly burst into life and jumped at him off the workbench. He lived just around the corner from the local hospital and walked to the ER holding a towel to stem the bleeding.

Yes, he had been a modeller for many, many years but it was his first EP model.

I am also finding that fatigue is a major factor in home based injuries as pilots are making adjustments to their models after a day's work, a long night out or a restless night's sleep. Being tired is a sure way to get hurt or get into a situation of near misses.

For myself, I have had to learn the hard way on this. Now, if I do not feel 'right', I do not even go near the workshop or the field. My working day is a long one and I also work most Saturdays, so Sunday can be a no go for me.

Fatigue is also finding its way into 'at the field accidents' and this can be from the first flight of the day to the last of several flights. Being a close witness to such happenings where a pilot, who had flown extremely well all day over eight or nine flights, suddenly, on final approach, gave his model full throttle and then dived into the ground from thirty feet. He was simply too tired to concentrate any more.

As a final note for this edition, a house just around the corner from me was burned to a shell, when a LIPO battery exploded under the house and gutted the entire dwelling. On the upside all the family got away from the house without injury [as well as their two dogs] but they have lost all their possessions and the kids' toys.

I had only been talking to the family just a month or so before as they had just moved in after purchasing the house. The battery was being charged up for a drone and it did not want to play anymore. The family have had to suffer through a Police investigation and a lot of finger pointing from the general public. Totally unfair....

HEAVE HO International FF Glider Postal Competition Sponsored by Len Surtees STING MK2 Gliders

Welcome to the 10th HH world postal competition for Free Flight Hand Launch Gliders. Competition runs from 1st to 31st July 2021. The 3 categories are.

- 1/ Hand Launch Glider (hand grip on fuselage)
- 2/ Catapult Launch Glider (1/16" x 1/4" x 9" loop)
- 3/ Tip Launch Glider (hand grip on wing tip) Note: I included TLG back in 2005 and 2006 which was the beginning of the FF Glider revolution due to Mark Benns clever gadget free design which all TLG designs have copied with various modifications.

PRIZE: STING MK 2 Glider Kits and winner of HLG name will be engraved on the Trophy

RULES: All categories fly to a 1-minute maximum time limit. All categories fly 9 official flights (you can have more than one go but cannot mix or combine scores)



Times must be recorded by a timekeeper. If you achieve 5×60 second maximum flights then you must add 30 second being now 90 second flight, if you achieve this then keep adding 30 seconds till you miss the maximum but include the last flight.

EXAMPLE: 5×60 seconds, add 30 = 90 then add 30 seconds = 120 then add 30 seconds = 150, then a flight of 37 seconds. score card will be 60,60,60,60,60,+90,120,150,37

Indoor Control line aerobatics

We have all seen and or competed indoor events at some stage. Mostly being Free Flight or RC.

On the 10th of July during the West Wyalong Nationals a few of us will be showcasing indoor F2B control line aerobatics from 330pm to 7pm. These models are the idea of Slovakian Born Igor Burger, an F2B world champion who has revolutionised electric F2B aerobatics and now indoor control line.

These models are constructed from 3mm thick foam (depron) with some carbon spars for strength, and very easy to build.

The models use an active timer like we use on our large F2B electric models, but a version for indoors using a Spin 11 ESC, a light motor with KV 1400 to 1500 rpm/V for max power boost uphill. It should be as light as possible.

The model flies with a relatively large prop which gives good vertical performance. We use an orange GWS 10x4.7 at approximately 4500 rpm.

The Model flies lap times like our large outside models, this means approximately 5.3s. Line tension is secured by large yaw angle approximately 20 degrees and large nose area.

These models are flown on 5m long fishing lines. Using low stretching Spiderwire lines 0.12mm on very light handle as the model does not pull too much.

Many pilots around the world in many countries are now flying these models and having local and international competitions. They are also great for the kids and beginners.

My aim is for as many pilots that are interested to come along and have a go. I would love to see more pilots flying these models and eventually having fun competitions at our major state and national events. Please come along and have a go. Everyone is welcome.


